In the first Saturday morning fixture for the year, the Rostrevor 1st XI travelled to Pulteney. In what can be described as a clinical victory, the Rostrevor lads claimed a comfortable victory. **Declan Candy**, making his debut up front headed home the first before **Patrick Caraccia**'s free-kick crept in after being missed by the keeper. **Louis Conterno** rifled in a shot, Caraccia slotted home a well worked second and Candy bundled in his second, and Rostrevor's fifth, to add to the Red 'n' Black's lead. **Lucas Fazzini** headed in a sixth as Pulteney were punished for a sub-standard performance.


The Pulteney side's disgruntled fans started streaming out of the parklands following the Rossi fifth after 65 minutes and there were plenty of empty spaces at the final whistle.

Conterno, who was the man of the match as stand in skipper, for the injured Monda, did not take long to remind people of his qualities as he nodded in for his first goal of the season, while he also had an effort well saved by the keeper following a good move. The ever present Caraccia certainly gave Rostrevor a greater cutting edge in the attacking midfield area and the coach Coop had the luxury of taking him off after 62 minutes, with a mind to future battles. "It was great to play up front but it was more important that the team won," said Candy. "It was great to get so many goals."

Pulteney started brightly and, coached by a former Adelaide United player, were well organised. However, any hope it was the start of some kind of great escape quickly dissolved. The Rostrevor performance was lit up by solid defending, good discipline and individual skill, with some stand out work from **Mark Ulaj**, **Sammy Belyovski** and **Michael Sosa** holding a firm triangle in the defensive half. A consolation goal even deserted Pulteney when a late curler hit the woodwork in a heavy defeat.
