#### Term 2 and 3 Winter Coaching and Umpiring

I have filled many of the coaching positions required for the upcoming winter co-curricular season, however I would be very interested to hear from anyone who would be keen to coach a middle years or senior soccer team.

#### 1st XI Cricket

Sacred Heart 9/121 from 50 overs (Ned McKay 3/9, Patrick Shrestha 2/15, Murphy Short 2/26)

Lost to Rostrevor College 5/122 from 37 overs (Murphy Short 54, Harrison Rahaley 31)

This was a fantastic result to reclaim the Intercol Trophy in a rain affected match. Despite the game being reduced from 2 days to 1 day, we felt confident going in that our best would be good enough to get the result in this fixture.

Sacred Heart won the toss and elected to bat on a pitch where we would have chosen to field first, given the recent rainfall. Our bowling has been strong all year and captain Dylan Smith and Patrick Shrestha bowled tightly and despite not making the breakthrough, Sacred Heart's run rate was less than 2 per over. **Ned McKay** bowled beautifully and was the pick of our bowlers. His figures of 10 overs, 3/9 highlight just how well he bowled. He was well supported by **Murphy Short** (2/26), who bowled fast in his first spell and then left arm orthodox spin in his second spell. Shrestha claimed 2 important wickets later in the innings and his figures of 10 overs 2/15 were also just reward for effort. Harry Petty and Harrison Rahaley also did their bit in keeping things tight. It was disappointing to not take the 10 wickets, but we felt that 121 was well within our range.

In reply, we started shakily, losing 3 quick wickets before the score reached 30. A 70 run partnership between **Murphy Short** (54) and **Harrison Rahaley** (31) opened up the game. When chasing a relatively small target, it only takes one good partnership to turn the game and that is exactly what those boys did. Dylan Fitzsimons and Guy Hutchinson came in towards the end and made sure that we passed Sacred Heart's score for the loss of five wickets.

Murphy Short was awarded the George Arnfield Medal for his all-round efforts, narrowly claiming that title from **Ned McKay** who was instrumental in us reducing Sacred Heart to 121.

A special thanks to the whole squad, led superbly by **Dylan Smith** for their hard work this term. Cricket takes a huge time commitment and I am proud of every single player who has made up our 1st XI Squad this term. A huge thank you to the parents and staff for their support also. This was a fitting way to finish the term.
